- **Class 202** Greenhouse, shed or cold frame
- **Class 203** Hanging basket, window box, container
- **Class 204** A home-grown indoor pot plant

FRUIT & VEGETABLES

- **Class 301** 3 or more tomatoes on the plant - any variety
- **Class 302** Best plant with 2 or more courgettes
- **Class 303** Any kind of lettuce in the ground
- **Class 304** 3 carrots dug from the garden
- **Class 305** 2 longest runner beans with a ruler / measure in the photograph
- **Class 306** My vegetable disaster!
- **Class 307** 3 cooking apples on a plate
- **Class 308** 3 fruit of any tree
- **Class 309** A plate of any soft fruit from the garden
- **Class 310** A plate of any 3 different fruits from the garden

FLOWERS

- **Class 401** Your best flower or flowers either on the plant or arranged in a vase
- **Class 402** Roses
- **Class 403** Dahlias
- **Class 404** Any home-grown annuals
- **Class 405** Any home-grown perennials
- **Class 406** An arrangement of seasonal flowers in a vase or suitable for a meal table on a rainbow theme

- **Class 501** 'Lockdown joy'

- **Class 503** A 'garden pest'
